

Summer Assignment: Worldview in *The Chronicles of Narnia* Chart

C.S. Lewis incorporates many elements of the Biblical account and a Biblical Worldview in his *The Chronicle of Narnia* series. While reading these three books, please look for how Lewis portrays the Universe, Creation, Humanity, Good vs. Evil, and God. **You will need use this information in the first quarter for homework assignments and an essay, so please pay careful attention and write down specific examples/quotes and the page number you found them on so you can refer to it later on!**

As you read these three books, please use the below chart to keep track of examples and the corresponding book/page numbers you find for each of the below topics. A minimum of 3 examples should be listed for each of these categories and you can use additional pages if we did not give you enough room. You may not be able to pull out an example of each topic from each book and that is okay.

Book Short Hand: MN (*The Magician's Nephew*), LWW (*The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe*), HHB (*The Horse and His Boy*)

The Universe: As you read, consider these questions: What is the Universe like that Narnia is apart of? How is it connected to our own world? How are the worlds and countries similar to or different from one another? Are the worlds chaotic or are they governed by some kind of laws or force?
